I understand that before my child is allowed to practice or play, a current valid Medical History Form, a sport's fee payment and a signed Participation Permission Agreement must be completed and turned into the administration office. Students must attend practices, have a positive attitude, and always demonstrate good behavior and respect to their peers and coaches. Only coaches select sport teams, starting players and length of playing time. Parents or legal guardians are not allowed to assist with practice or games unless they have successfully completed VIRTUS training and a criminal background check. All parents must always show good sportsmanship and respect to all. Children are not allowed to attend sport events without a parent unless they are on the Saint Pius V team. Any child attending practices or games not on the team must be within immediate view and control of the parent or legal guardian at all times. Children or students are not allowed with another parent at any practice or game unless there is written permission from their parents or legal guardians. The guardian or parent, with written permission, is responsible for the child to be within immediate view and control of the student at all times. When problems arise, the parent and/or student should talk to the coach the first day following the game or practice. If the problem is not resolved with the coach, the parents and/or students should schedule an appointment with the Athletic Director. If the Athletic Director is unable to solve the problem, then a meeting with the Principal and the Athletic Director may be scheduled. Any student, child, parent, legal guardian or relative not abiding by any part of this agreement will be considered out of line and consequences will be enforced.
